- represent the School in Interschool competitions (for Equestrian represent the School in at least four Interschool Qld competitions)
- represent the School in all required meets
- demonstrate excellent behaviour, school spirit and playing conduct.

- a member of a Premiership winning team for a QGSSSA Open event
- an individual winning a QGSSSA Open/Division A event
- member of an A relay placing 1st in a QGSSSA event
- an individual selected in an Australian team or placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd at School Sport Australia (SSA) titles.

Full Pockets (White laurel leaves with white line below pocket) will be awarded to the following students:

 selected in an Australian team or placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd at National titles or an officially recognised interschool National level competition. The student must have represented the School in Equestrian during the season.

Half Pockets (White laurel leaves with white line below pocket) will be awarded to the following students:

- an individual whose exceptional performance is deemed commensurate with the standard of this award, in a recognised interschool sporting competition.

Performing Arts Pockets

Commitment

Once you have made a commitment to one or more Ensemble, Choir, Dance Troupe and/or Theatresports group you must:

- Attend weekly ensemble, choir, Theatresports group and/or dance troupe rehearsals;
- Demonstrate 100% commitment in all rehearsals, performances and competitions;
- Participate in all ensemble, choir, Theatresports group and/or dance troupe rehearsals, performances, and competitions
- Support your ensemble, choir, Theatresports group and/or dance troupe.

It is essential that all ensemble, choir, Theatresports group and/or dance troupe members remember that they are performing in an ensemble and should aim to create a well-balanced performance.

Attendance

Attendance rolls are kept in order to determine pocket eligibility of the students in the music, choir, Theatresports group and/or dance groups throughout the year. It is, therefore, essential that students advise the appropriate Director/Director of Co-curricular Arts PRIOR to an absence. For example, an absence due to illness, injury or school sporting commitments, which will impact on REHEARSALS and COMPETITION/PERFORMANCES (refer to Pocket Eligibility). Students may forfeit their eligibility for a pocket, if they fail to inform the appropriate Director/Director of Co-curricular Arts, of their absence, in writing, from the parent/guardian prior to the event. Remember, you must attend a minimum of 90% of all group rehearsals and 100% of group performances to qualify for a POCKET at the end of the year.

It is advised not to schedule specialist appointments during the weekly rehearsal times. If this is unavoidable prior notification, in writing, from the parent/guardian of the student must be received by the Director of Co-curricular Arts at least one week in advance.

Without this written confirmation, the individual student's attendance record may be affected.

- Demonstrates leadership in the choir

To be eligible for Pockets in the annual Youth Theatresports program, students must attend 100% of heats/competitions and 90% of all training sessions. A parental note/email is required if students are unable to attend competitions and rehearsals and this must be received by the Director of Co-curricular Arts, prior to the performance or rehearsal.

Full Pockets (White laurel leaves with white line below pocket) will be awarded to the following students:

- Demonstrate exemplary behaviour, attitude and commitment
- Demonstrate leadership in the team
- Participate in all competitions
- Assist the Theatresports Coach
