Academic Scholarship *Information for Candidates*

Academic Scholarships reward and recognise new and current students entering Years 7 to 12 for academic excellence.

Selection is based on:

- Results of a scholarship examination
- Recent academic reports
- Record of excellent behaviour
- Interview with the Dean of Studies (shortlisted candidates only)

Students are expected to participate actively in all aspects of an all-round education and support others at Ipswich Girls' Grammar School.

The scholarship represents up to 50% remission of tuition fees.

Selection Process

- Academic scholarship applicants must sit for the scholarship examination administered by Academic Assessment Services at the School on the morning of **Saturday, 24 March, 2018**.
- For applicants residing outside the Brisbane and Ipswich metropolitan areas, it may be possible to complete the Scholarship Examination locally under strict supervision. There is an additional fee for this service. Such applications should be made using the rural and interstate link available through the scholarship application portal.
- Results of the scholarship examination will be forwarded to parents/guardians after the test.
- Applicants will be short listed for an interview based on the results of the scholarship examination and recent academic reports.

Conditions

- Scholarships offered to students entering Years 7, 8 and 9 are tenable until the end of Year 10, subject to review. Existing scholars are encouraged to re-apply in Year 10 to extend their scholarship through until the end of Year 12.
- Scholarships offered to students entering Years 10, 11 and 12 are tenable until the end of Year 12.
- This means that if the conditions of the Scholarship continue to be met, the student retains the Scholarship for the tenure or until she leaves IGGs. Scholarships are not means tested.

If successful, in order to maintain the Scholarship, the student must:

- Maintain a consistently high level of academic performance (reviewed each semester).

- Demonstrate a willingness to contribute to the curricular and co-curricular activities of the School, that is, participate in at least two of the following: one sport, one service and one cultural activity each year (reviewed annually).
- Comply with the School's high expectations regarding attitudes, behaviour, uniform, and use of technology (reviewed each semester).
- Not bring discredit to the School in any way (*immediate cancellation*).

The student's family must:

- Pay the balance of any account within four weeks of each term's commencement.
- Provide in writing to the Board of Trustees an explanation about any delay in settling an account and a request to arrange alternative payment options.
- Actively support the School's Parents & Friends Association.

How to Apply?

- Register and complete the online scholarship application form accessible through www.girlsgrammar.com.au/scholarships including payment of the application fee (\$95).
- On time applications for 2019 entry close **Monday, 19 March, 2018**. Late applications will be accepted until 23 March, but will attract a late fee (\$145).
- All applicants must sit the scholarship examination at Ipswich Girls' Grammar School on **Saturday 24 March**. (Rural and interstate applicants may be able to sit the examination remotely under strict supervision).
- Shortlisted applicants will then be asked to attend an interview with the Dean of Studies.
